<u>Call to Order:</u> This meeting of the Public Hearing and General Board was called to order by Chairperson Daley at 7:05p.m.

Chairperson's Report:

- Acknowledgement of new board members.
- We did a walkthrough on April 22^{nd,} and we want to do that more often.

- An MTA walk through was done; we are looking for new ways for the bus system route within our community.
- Planning to an end of year culmination event for all board members/meet and greet at the end of next month.
- Unused time by the end of June, we will know what we will be able to carry over next vear.
- Congresswoman Yvette Clark will have two events, one this Friday 6-8 and each board member will get an invitation. The second event in June is specifically for board and community members.
- Our secretary is out for a few months, so in the meantime we do not have a secretary.
 Monzurat Oni will be taking over the duties as Communications Chair. There cannot be anyone appointed as secretary but if anyone would like to assist until June, please send an email.

District Manager's Report:

- On April 25th at Flatbush Junction, for the MTA walkthrough the impact of the B6 bus stop removal on two nearby schools: PS IS 109 and PS198 was highlighted. This project is in its early phase so all the requests will be reviewed.
- A district service cabinet meeting was held on April 26th, several agencies were in attendance regarding service delivery to the district. Some issues such as the need for inspection and corrective actions at Snyder Ave between East 58th and 59th Street for the flooding condition.
- DEP responded and inspected the location and reported their findings to DOT. DOT inspected and determined that there was roadway depression and recommended repairs.
- At last months meeting, residents submitted any complaints they may have, and we continue to work on those.

Youth and Education: Gail Grandison- Last week we had a Cops & Kids event in lieu of our meeting in partnership with the Boys and Girls Club. It was great event but next time we hope to see more people there. Thank you to those who were in attendance. Our next meeting is on June 8th at 7:30 p.m. virtually.

Parks & Beautification: Berlotte Antoine- Our next event will be on June 10th from 10a.m. to 12p.m. which will be a cleanup project at Tilden Park. Our partners Elite Learners will provide volunteers but if you want to volunteer you can call the community board and give your name. Our next meeting will be on June 6th and there will be a presentation on emergency preparedness. On June 19th will be our healthy eating and cooking fair.

Sanitation/Environmental: Dr. Carol Reneau- The reviews of complaints for sanitation continues, anything sanitation related please keep sending them in. You can email them in, and we had a big cleanup last Saturday. We asked that the elected officials who are here please help to enforce the laws because we know that not all the laws are being enforced. We will do a cleanup on the last Saturday of every month, and you can join us the third Monday of every month for our meetings.

Bylaws: Julia James- According to the bylaws, amendments to the bylaws may be proposed by any member of the board at a regular or special board meeting. At the last meeting we discussed various issues regarding the committees and later I will propose an amendment to be voted on.

Rezoning: Julia James- We are actively working on developing a rezoning plan and we were able to engage three consultants and they are working on coming up with a plan. We do need

funds, and this was decided last minute but we wanted to ask if we can vote on having a letter sent to a city council person to request some funding for 2024.

Hospitality: Welcome to new members. We will be having a mixer on June 7th as a meet and greet. We would like to have everyone there, details and location to come.

Brookdale Cap: Janice Reid- Just an update regarding two events coming up, one on this Friday May 19th from 12-4 called the Spring Forward into Wellness at 1833 Eastern Parkway and the other is about three health fairs with the first being on June 10th at Brookdale Hospital, another on June 15th location TAD and August 19th on Eastern Parkway.

Treasury: Ozni Lewis- Our total uncommitted budget so far is \$36,114.65. Our discretionary fund is at \$42,000 which has been put to good use. 1. Chairperson of Bylaws Julia James is presenting this change to the bylaws since it must be presented and discussed prior to the vote. NO vote tonight.

Amendment NO.1: The public has the right to attend meetings of public bodies, listen to debate and watch the decision-making process.

Proposes the following section to be **deleted**: "Article IV 3, Non-Board Members on Committees: 3. The Chairperson may appoint to such committees' persons with a residence or significant interest in the community who are not members of the Board, but each Committee shall have a member of the Board as its Chairperson." Propose the following section be **inserted**: "Article IV 3 Board Members Committee Membership: 3. All Board members are required to serve on at least two committees.* Article IV 4, Non-Board Members Committee Membership: 4. The Chairperson may appoint to such Committees as non-board members, only persons who (1) must be a New York City resident and (2) must live or maintain their primary work address in Community District 17, but each Committee shall have a member of the Board as its Chairperson."

Chairperson Daley rises to amend: There should be a part three "Of significant interest because the people who run community-based organizations are a part of real significant interests within the community. I do agree with part 1 and 2.

Amendment NO.2: We have condensed the standing committees to: Land Use, Personnel, Parks and Beautification, Youth and Education, Transportation and Public Safety, Human Services (Social & community Services, Health & Mental Health), Budget, Commerce, Sanitation and Environmental Protection & Housing and Block Associations.
