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## Education & Youth Committee Spelling Bee Competition Rules May 2024

These rules and requirements ensure fairness and eligibility for participants in the competition. We aim to use a reliable and authoritative source for all the words. These guidelines provide consistency and adherence to the rules throughout the competition, with the judges serving as impartial arbiters of the proceedings.

### Participants Grades

Grades - 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>

Grades - 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>

Grades - 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>

### Eligibility Requirements

**School/ home Location:** Participants **must attend a school or live** within the specified boundaries of Community Board 17.

**Grade Level:** Participants must not have passed beyond seventh grade (7<sup>th</sup>) by May 2024.

**Application Deadline:** Participants meeting the qualifications must submit a completed application form no later than **May 13, 2024**.

**Disqualification:** The board reserves the right to disqualify participants who do not comply with the eligibility requirements. This disqualification can occur at any time, including before or during the competition. If a participant is found to have not met the eligibility requirements, they may be required to forfeit any prizes or benefits.

### Official Dictionary and Source of Words

The provided information establishes the Merriam-Webster online dictionary as the official dictionary and source of words for the spelling bee. Here's a breakdown of its role:

**Final Authority:** Merriam-Webster is the competition's ultimate authority for spelling words.

**Primary Source for Crafting:** It is used as the primary source for crafting pronunciations, definitions, and language origins for the competition.

**Source for Prepared Lists:** Merriam-Webster is the sole source used to verify information in the prepared lists for the competition.

**Acceptance Criteria for Multiple Spellings:** If there are multiple spellings for a word, any of these spellings will be accepted as correct if they meet three criteria: (1) identical pronunciations, (2) identical definitions, and (3) identification as standard variants of each other.

### Time Constraints

These time constraints outline the rules regarding the duration of a participant's turn at the microphone during the competition:

**Time Limit:** Participants have a maximum of 2 minutes at the microphone. The timer starts when the pronouncer first pronounces the word. The Participant can spell the word for 1 minute and 15 seconds.

**Timekeeper:** A designated timekeeper will inform the Participant about the time remaining.

**No Communication in Final 30 Seconds:** During the final 30 seconds of the Participant's time, judges and the pronouncer will not communicate with the Participant.

**Disqualification for Incomplete Spelling:** If the Participant fails to provide a complete spelling before the expiration of the allotted time, the judges will disqualify them.

### Pronouncer's Role

The pronouncer facilitates the spelling bee competition by providing accurate pronunciations and necessary information to the participants. Here's a breakdown of the pronouncer's role based on the provided information:

**Correct Pronunciation:** The pronouncer endeavors to pronounce words according to the diacritical markings in Webster's online dictionary to ensure accuracy and consistency in pronunciation.

**Homonyms:** If a word has multiple homonyms, the pronouncer clarifies which word is to be spelled by defining the word.

**Responding to Participant's Requests:** During the oral competition, the pronouncer only responds to the Participant's requests for:

- Repetition of the word's pronunciation
- Definition of the word
- Sentence using the word
- Part of speech of the word
- Language(s) of origin of the word
- Alternate pronunciation(s) of the word

If the Participant requests alternate pronunciations, the pronouncer checks for them in Webster's dictionary.

Additionally, if the Participant wants to inquire if a specific root word is listed as the root of the word to be spelled, they must specify the pronunciation of the root (not the spelling), its language, and its definition. The pronouncer accommodates these requests as long as they comply with the time constraints outlined in the rules.

Overall, the pronouncer ensures fairness and clarity in the competition by providing necessary information and assistance to the participants while adhering to the established guidelines.

### Judges Role

The judges play a pivotal role in maintaining the integrity and fairness of the spelling bee competition. Here's a breakdown of the judges' responsibilities based on the provided information:

1. **Determining Correct Spelling:** The judges carefully listen to the participants' spellings, determine whether the words are spelled correctly, and ensure adherence to the rules. Their decisions are final.
2. **Handling Misunderstandings:** While the judges do not respond to the Participant's questions about the word and its pronunciation, if they sense that the Participant has misunderstood the word, they direct the Participant and pronouncer to interact until reasonable attempts have been made to assist the Participant in understanding the word within the time constraints.
3. **Addressing Pronouncer Errors:** If the judges perceive that the pronouncer's pronunciation does not match the pronunciation specified in the diacritical markings, they direct the pronouncer to correct the error as soon as it is detected.
4. **Disqualifications for Non-Spelling Reasons:** The judges have the authority to disqualify a participant for reasons other than an apparent misspelling, including:
  - Engaging in unsportsmanlike conduct.
  - Altering the letters or sequence of letters while retracing a spelling.
  - Uttering unintelligible or nonsense sounds during the spelling process.
5. **Participant Activities Not Meriting Disqualification:** The judges may not disqualify a participant for activities that do not warrant disqualification, such as:
  - Failing to pronounce the word before or after spelling it.
  - Asking a question for clarification.
  - Noting or failing to mention the capitalization of a word, the presence of a diacritical mark, or the presence of punctuation like a hyphen.

### Participant's Role

The Participant's role in the spelling bee competition is crucial for their successful participation. Here's an overview of their responsibilities based on the provided information:

1. **Identification:** Each contestant receives an identifying number for use throughout the competition.

2. **Stage Entry:** Contestants are called to the stage to spell using their identification number.
3. **Order of Spelling:** Participants are called onto the stage to spell their words according to their grade level.
4. **Spelling Protocol:** The Participant faces the judges and pronounces the word before and after spelling it. Failing to pronounce the word before or after spelling it does not result in disqualification.
5. **Precise Spelling:** The Participant utters each letter distinctly and with sufficient volume to be understood by the judge.
6. **Requesting Assistance:** Participants may ask the pronouncer for various forms of assistance, including repeating the word, defining it, using it in a sentence, providing the part of speech, language(s) of origin, or alternate pronunciation(s).
7. **Responsibility for Understanding:** The Participant is responsible for any misunderstanding of the word unless:
  - The pronouncer never provided a correct pronunciation.
  - The pronouncer provided incorrect information regarding the definition, part of speech, or language of origin.
  - The Participant correctly spelled a homonym of the word, and the pronouncer failed to offer a definition or distinguish the homonyms.
8. **Restarting the Spelling Process:** Participants can stop at any time during the spelling process and begin again from the beginning. However, they cannot change any letters they initially started with before stopping. If any letter changes during the process, the Participant may be eliminated.

These guidelines ensure participants understand their roles and responsibilities during the competition, contributing to a fair and organized event.

### **Final two participants in each grade category**

These rules outline the process for determining the winner among the final two participants in each grade category:

1. **First Participant Misses a Word:** If the first Participant misses a word, the second Participant must correctly spell that word and then another word to win.
2. **Second Participant Misspells a Word:** If the second Participant misspells the word they were given or misspells the subsequent word, then the first Participant can spell a new word. If the first Participant spells this new word correctly, they are given yet another word to spell. If they also spell this new word correctly, they are declared the winner in that grade category.

### **Disqualification**

These rules outline the circumstances under which participants may be disqualified from the spelling bee:

1. **Refusal to Start Spelling:** Participants will be disqualified if they refuse the request to start spelling as instructed by the judges.
2. **Failure to Approach the Microphone:** Participants will be disqualified if they do not approach the microphone when it's time to receive the word.
3. **Unsportsmanlike Conduct:** Participants will be disqualified if they engage in unsportsmanlike conduct.
4. **Altering Spelling Sequence:** Participants will be disqualified if they change the letters or sequences of letters from those originally uttered in retracing a spelling word.
5. **Uttering Unintelligible or Nonsense Sounds:** Participants will be disqualified if, in the process of spelling, they utter unintelligible or nonsense sounds.
6. **Misspelling a Word:** Participants will be disqualified if they misspell a word.

These disqualification criteria ensure fairness and adherence to the spelling bee rules, maintaining the competition's integrity.
