The Youth Committee Meeting was held on Wednesday, April 12, 2023 at 7:30 p.m. virtually, via WebEx.

Ms. Gail Grandison called the meeting to order 7:40 pm and asked everyone to introduce themselves.

Everyone introduced themselves.

Ms. Grandison stated that they do not have quorum as of yet, she will continue to the next item on the agenda.

Notes

The meeting discussed upcoming events, programs, and initiatives focused on youth and education, including small business conference, spring extravaganza, health fair, parenting conference, college access program, tax preparation services, and the need for more time to complete taxes; they also discussed the importance of safe spaces for kids and partnering with community organizations, while facing challenges in securing a venue for a spelling bee event and considering providing spelling bee words ahead of time to students.

- The meeting is called to order by Gail Grandison, Chair of the Youth and Education Committee.
- Gail Grandison reminds attendees about meeting norms and encourages participation and respect for each other's opinions.

- Gail Grandison discusses upcoming events, including a small business conference, a spring extravaganza, a health fair, and a parenting conference. She also mentions the Brooklyn bus network redesign and the introduction of bike sharing programs in the community.
- The YWCA Brooklyn is a women's organization focused on eliminating racism and empowering women and girls.
- They offer permanent low-income housing for women, with over 300 units available.
- They have programs such as college access and leadership development for high school girls, as well as an ESOL program for immigrant women.
- The organization discussed their upcoming tax preparation services and the need for more time to complete taxes.
- They mentioned wanting to move to a new vendor and expand their services beyond their current community.
- They discussed their college access program, including the application process, academic requirements, and support services provided to students. They also mentioned their persistence model to ensure students graduate on time and have job opportunities after graduation.
- The meeting discussed the importance of getting kids off the streets and providing them with safe spaces.
- There was a discussion about partnering with organizations that cater to the community and provide resources for youth.
- Mentoring programs and initiatives to support girls in education were also mentioned.
- The second speaker, Ms. Bernard, who runs a modeling agency, couldn't attend the meeting due to illness.
- Ms. Grandison is having difficulty securing space for the spelling bee event and has been waiting for a response from SUNY Downstate since last year.
- The possibility of using Alliance Tabernacle as a venue for the event was discussed, but concerns were raised about space limitations and comfort for attendees.
- The committee discussed scheduling an event related to wills and generational wealth, with the proposed date being May 20th.
- There was a discussion about whether or not to provide the spelling bee words to the students ahead of time, with differing opinions on the matter.
